In 1998, Hilary Green continued her career as a senior manager and senior research scientist at the Milk and Health Research Center of the Institute for Food, Nutrition and Human Health at Massey University in New Zealand.

She joined Nestlé as a senior scientist and project manager in 2002 at the Nestlé Research Center in Switzerland. In 2005, she was appointed as Group Manager in the Food Intake Control Group again at the Nestlé Research Center. Hilary Green was appointed to her current role as Nestlé Global R&D Communications Head in 2008.
